



**Prof. Dr. Dr. Dipl. Psych. Harald Walach**

Harald Walach, Ph.D., is a research professor in psychology at the University of Northampton, where he has developed the postgraduate training programme MSc Transpersonal Psychology/Consciousness Studies. He is considered as one of the most prolific European researchers in the field of Complementary and Alternative Medicine, his main interest focused on the importance of non-specific and placebo effects.

In 1990 he obtained a Ph.D. in Clinical Psychology at the University of Bale with a homeopathic remedy proving, followed in 1995 by a further Ph.D. thesis in Philosophy and History of Science at the University of Vienna. In 1998 Harald obtained habilitation at Freiburg University with a thesis on the importance of non-specific effects of therapy at the example of homeopathy.

His more recent research interest is in the connection between spirituality, mindfulness and health, and he has helped develop questionnaires to measure mindfulness and exceptional human experiences. He is the head of the European Office of the Samueli Institute™ (SIIB), president of the International Society for Complementary Medical Research (ISCMR), vice-president of the German Society for Transpersonal Psychology and Psychotherapy, and editor of the journals *Forschende Komplementärmedizin – Research in Complementary and Classical Natural Medicine* (Karger), and *Spirituality and Health International* (Wiley).
